Cardiff's Covid-19 Recovery Plan

Pop-Up Cycleways





Rationale

Since the start of the social distancing and lockdown provisions during the Covid-19 pandemic, the capacity of public transport has been severely limited. Further more the capacity of the road network in Cardiff is insufficient to support all necessary journeys by car. To facilitate and enable more journeys a temporary and safe series of cycleways are to be installed along strategic routes within the city.

An Equality Impact Assessment (EqIA) and engagement with Cardiff Access Focus Group has been completed to support the scheme. The routes are following the alignments of the future permanent cycleways and, subject to funding, will become permanent.

Covid 19: Reduced public transport capacity

Limited road network which cannot support all journeys by car

Need for more journeys to be completed:

- · on foot
- · on bicycle
- whilst maintaining social distancing


Increase pedestrian space in district centres



Transport Improvement Temporary Provisions: Cross City South

Route

Linking Adamsdown to the Taff Trail, the Cross City South will be installed along East Tyndall Street from the Magic roundabout and along Herbert Street. It will continue through Callaghan Square connecting with Cardiff Central station. It will then continue along Penarth Road continuing over the bridge connecting with the Taff Trail. One lane of traffic will be removed along the majority of route to facilitate the pop up cycleway. Bus lanes and access to bus stops will be maintained where possible.






Transport Improvement Temporary Provisions: Cross City South

Cycleway


The pop up cycleway will be segregated from the road by semi-permanent bolt down wands, it will be reinforced by cycle road markings, signage and cycle-specific stages at junctions. Cyclists will be given dedicated cycleway traffic signals, and will be expected to adhere to the lights and the highway code as always.




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
